Director of Golf - Monthly Report

September saw the Matchplay Championship attract the biggest ever entry with 50 players competing to become the Club Champion. Rob Menzies defeated Orlando Hill 2 and 1 in the Men's final while Angela Scott became Ladies Champion defeating Melaura Parker 3 and 1. This was Melaura's second successive near miss in this event and hopefully next year will be third time lucky.

Repairs to the calçada paths will commence in mid October with work on the 1st Corks and 1st and 2nd on Olives being a priority. The areas around the clubhouse will be repaired in early December when these areas will be less busy.

Trimming of the pine trees will commence in mid November starting with the areas left of 9th Corks and left and right of 1st Olives.

I would like at this point to congratulate Sesinando and his staff for presenting the course in such excellent condition through a very hot summer and a very wet autumn. The condition and presentation of the golf course is my primary objective and therefore, in the recent very wet conditions we have not only limited golf buggies to the buggy paths but I have not allowed trolleys on the golf course. Rescue Clubs

Many people now own one but are there any tips to help with their use? Treat the club a little more like a long iron and grip to the top of the club. It is always advisable to have the ball position a little further back in the stance than for a driver (a steeper angle of attack helps). Finally try to extend your right shoulder through impact; it keeps the loft on the clubface for as long a time as possible ensuring a good ball flight.
