Pro Tip By Brian Evans

"Two Turns and a Swish"

Sometimes technique becomes over complicated. For a right hander the backswing is a turn of the body around the right leg and the downswing is a turn of the body around the left leg.

If the player does this and keeps hands and arms relaxed a swish will be produced through the impact area.
