The restaurant can cater for a private party of twenty or more people. The boat journey to and from the restaurant costs  $\in$ 10; alternatively, the guided boat Tour round the Ria Formosa (which also goes to the restaurant) costs  $\in$ 20. Lunch would probably be around  $\in$ 35 per head.
