Director of Golf - Monthly Report

As I write this on Monday morning 3rd May the world of golf has taken a seismic shift towards Ireland. The media's hitherto obsession with Tiger Woods has now been replaced by the amazing performance of Rory McIlroy. The ridiculous Sky coverage of the Quail Hollow Championship from the US which on Saturday seemed to spend more time talking about why Tiger (74-79) missed the cut than the players who made the cut was quite rightly replaced in Sunday's last round by the Irishman's course record 62. Rory has gone from 1 over par, the cut line; too 15 under par over the last two rounds to force a stunned but respectful Phil Mickelson into 2nd spot 4 shots behind the young pretender.

You may ask why I mention this in the Pinheiros Altos Newsletter and I have two reasons. Firstly, it marks a changing of the guard and a new era in golf. Palmer overlapped with Nicklaus, Nicklaus with Woods and now Woods with McIlroy. Secondly, I can guarantee that McIlroy will overlap with a player younger than the 20 years that he is now. This brings me to my second point being that all golf clubs should encourage the younger members to play the best golf they can. In my days as a junior I could not play in "Club" competitions even when at 15 I was Cheshire boys champion playing off 2 handicap. I would like to think that if a young girl or boy at Pinheiros Altos is capable of competing off scratch against the "grown ups" then we should provide them with every opportunity and encourage the next Rory McIlroy!

The golf course is still very green after all our early rain but after a light top dressing at the end of April the greens have slowed slightly which I never like to see. I expect them to find their pace again by mid June ready for what should be a very exciting Summer. The tees and fairways have improved dramatically and while we must put this down to the rain, Sesinando and his staff have had to be very busy to keep up with the growth brought about by water and sun and fertilizer. The new pines are shooting up but I have plans for more of the same which ultimately will make for an even more interesting and difficult golf course. I was hoping to remove the stakes towards the end of the year but I have been advised to keep them in place "until they rot and fade away" but then I think he was trying to protect his handicap!
