Visualize – then commit

On any pitch or chip you must have a mental picture of the shot your are attempting. The routine must be – first to examine the lie of the ball, then look at the flag, then visualize the ball landing on the green and rolling to the hole and finally select the club most suitable for the job (not always the wedge!)


