#### Triggers

It is important in setting up to the ball that we don't freeze, but always have continuous motion in either the hands or lower body. There are numerous ways to trigger the swing, from Jack Nicklaus' famous chin swivel to Gary Players' right knee kick in. These habits give you the signal to smoothly begin the swing. Study the triggers of good players, experiment to find what works best for you and then practice it until it becomes second nature.
