## Director of Golf - Monthly Report

Even after a busy Easter the tournaments just kept coming!

The APPA (Pinheiros Altos Owners Association) Tournament attracted a large field of 52 players with 64 attending dinner in the Clubhouse. Roger Kitson presented the prizes with Peter Newbald winning the APPA Trophy with a best of the day 35 pts, from David Pirret with 33 pts. Sumbaline Waters took the Ladies by the narrowest of margins (best last 6 holes) from Eva Lamaison, both having 32 pts.

play off evaporated, leaving Tim the very worthy and relieved Club Champion.

The Ladies Championship was won by Sally Evans, who took the title by two shots from an ever improving Susan Russell. As the congregation gathered for the prize giving, Sally revealed that her victory had come despite her golf director husband disturbing her preparation for the event with his snoring! 

#### PRO TIP – Kenny Fairbairn

#### Uphill and Downhill Lies

We are all guilty. Rushing in to play a shot thinking it is a flat lie and then topping or thinning the ball. Try to stick to some simple but effective rules:

- 1) Use the golf club across your shoulders to help line them up parallel to the slope (very important point!)
- Uphill narrow stance
   Downhill wide stance
- 3) Stick to a central ball position for both. It avoids complications with the alignment.
- 4) Never try to hit too hard. Take less loft uphill, a little more loft downhill and hit calmly.

Sorry, we don't have anywhere to practice on the driving range but do your best the next time you play the course.
