
### Director of Golf - Monthly Report


Captain's Day was a great success and I would like to congratulate Mr. David Markey and his wife Mai for organising such a special day. There was tremendous support for a very hard working Captain.

#### PRO TIP - Ross Sutherland

How many people have a pre-shot routine for their putting? I bet not many! A routine will help you feel confident and breed consistency into your putting.

Here is a simple routine:

- 1) Stand beside the ball and make 2 practise swings.
- 2) Now address the ball and look at the hole to gauge the distance. Once you have done this get your eyes focused on the ball and make the stroke. (be careful as the longer you take to make the stroke your feel for the distance will diminish)
