## Director of Golf - Monthly Report

Congratulations to Tim Russell and Lady Captain Rie Cherubini on their respective victories in the Pinheiros Altos Mens and Ladies Strokeplay Championships.

Tim, who had been in Par breaking form going into the event took the title by 5 shots from runner up John Waters. Rie won her title by a single shot from fast finishing Melaura Parker.

Upcoming events include the Annual Ben Hogan Trophy match played between Pinheiros Altos and Quinta do Lagoon the 10 and 11th May. Pinheiros Altos led by Captain Graeme Thomson, will be all out to recover the Trophy which was lost last year.

The 23rd to 26th May is the Mixed Pairs Match Play Championship which I would like to see well contended to produce worthy champions, although reigning Champions Rie Cherubini and Christian Holst will be very reluctant to part with the trophy which they won in fine style last year.

The two biggest events in the Pinheiros Altos calendar are fast approaching. Graeme Thomson's Captain's Day will be played on the 22nd June while the 18th Gala Week takes it usual slot at the end of July (21st - 27th).

Both events will be all singing and dancing affairs in terms of commitment from the organizers and we look forward to a great response from the membership.

#### Golf Course changes:-

**3rd Corks**: the reshaped bunkers to the right of the green are now in play.

**3rd Olives**: fifteen new pine trees have been planted to catch the errant shot to the green. I can assure you that as time goes by this hole will become more and more of a challenge.

**9th Corks**: repairs to the calcada paths behind this tee, the creation of a new trolley path to make easier access to the tees from the calcada path above and the levelling of the two lower mens tees are all works to be carried out this Summer.

Efforts are also afoot to make the road between the 3rd green Pines and the 4th Tee Pines more attractive. New fencing has been erected around the Maintenance building and Cupressocyparis Leylandi trees have been planted, which will eventually obscure the view of the fence and the maintenance buildings.

Plans are in place to renew the restroom for the golfers on this walk and paint both the canteen and maintenance buildings in white and dark green respectively. A garden and the planting of fruit trees is also planned to take your mind of your golf, just for a moment!

## Pro Tip - Brian Evans

#### Strong Grip to Draw

A simple adjustment produces more power

Most women tend to slice the ball, and if this is the case, they must not be frightened of adopting a powerful grip.

The left hand particularly should be placed well on top of the shaft, with as many as three knuckles showing and the thumb well to the right side of the grip.

The shaft should be held firmly in both the palm and fingers, and there should be a feeling that the club is nestling deep in the hand so the fingers can really hold on to it.
