The trophy was originally presented by Tim Russell, who made the trip especially to be here for the ceremony.

# Congratulations to Jessica!

After practicing at Pinheiros Altos over the winter, JESSICA HALL has become the youngest winner of the Durham County Ladies Championship in 92 years of competition.

The Bishop Auckland Golf Club teenager claimed the title at the age of just 15 years and two months, setting a new record for a Championship first played for in 1922.

Hall, from Witton-le-Wear, County Durham, defeated Beamish Park's Natasha Martin 4&2 to bring an end to three days of enthralling golf at Darlington Golf Club.

After two initial rounds of Strokeplay, Hall was one of 16 golfers to progress to the Matchplay on Saturday morning. Reduced to eight for further Matchplay action on the following day, Hall had to battle her way through a gruelling semi-final. She was five down after nine but somehow fought back to clinch a place in the final by winning at the 19th hole. She went into the final and defeated Martin.

## PRO TIP by Kenny Fairbairn

#### How to Unfold the Right Arm Properly in the Downswing

In most good golf swings, the right arm is slightly bent and the right elbow points down, not out, at impact.

Otherwise, there's the danger that the right side will grab control of the swing, invariably with dire results.

Past impact, however, the right arm does straighten and extend toward the target. It's a sweeping-through motion from which I get the feeling I could reach out and retrieve the flying ball with my right hand.

Dear Rie,

Thank you for all the support you have given to the ACCA charity throughout your year as Lady Captain of Pinheiros Altos, it is greatly appreciated.

I promised to let you know how we would be spending the donation of €1369.65 given to us on 12th April 2014, and I am now in a position to do so.

Recently, a five year old little girl called Rosa was taken into one of the children's homes we support; Rosa's mother has social problems and is no longer able to take care of her daughter.

Rosa was born with Spina Bifida requiring her to undergo many operations, and she has suffered numerous infections, some of which were due to the poor hygiene she received while living with her mother.

In hospital in Lisbon, Rosa was fitted with a 'Peg Tube', this was inserted in her stomach to enable them to feed her when she refused to eat. Happily, since arriving at the children's home she has not needed this, and is now eating normally. However, the area surrounding the 'Peg Tube' needs cleaning several times a day to ensure it does not become infected. Rosa also suffers from incontinence, she has a catheter fitted which needs emptying 6/8 times a day and needs to wear appropriate nappies.

Despite all of these problems Rosa is a happy, bright little girl, and she has settled into the home very quickly, it is a delight to watch her interact with all of the other children.

This home does not have sufficient funds to cover the cost of the lengthy prescription they have been given for Rosa, and while some items will be covered by an allowance from the State, there are many that will not. ACCA is currently negotiating the bulk purchase of some medical items which would result in a saving of 25%, but they do need our help to cover the pharmacy bills they have already incurred.

Your kind donation has been used to pay for the first 2 months medication costs, and we will continue with our fundraising to help with their future needs.

Please convey our thanks to all the members, once again their incredible generosity has made a positive difference to another a child in need.
