

September will now start to be busier as the golf season is on the way with the President & Senior Championship during the first weekend, make sure your names are down for the Match-play Championship in mid-September.


Also this month our club roll up will start again every Tuesday lunchtime and the Social will also have a section for players who wish to play only 9 holes and join the supper!

U16 boys' international England V Wales at Radyr Golf Club Strong finish gives England victory.

A strong finish brought England a two-point victory in the annual U16 boys' international against Wales at Radyr Golf Club.

They won the final singles session 4½-3½ to seal an 11-9 win against a strong Welsh side. Team manager Nick Over remarked: "The boys did well to beat a competitive Welsh team.

"It was a close match and the result was in doubt until the last two matches finished on the 18th."

England went into the final session with a one point lead, after winning the opening singles 5-3 and taking 1½ points from the four foursomes. The result was eventually decided in today's singles when Taylor Stote won his point on the 18th and Harvey Byers halved his game. Byers was unbeaten during the three sessions.

Report from the Greens Committee

August is a quiet month but the grass continues to grow and the weeds do not know they should remain underground! Despite that and the absence of both Christophe and Sesinando on holiday the course has been doing rather well!

Our ambitions have always been based on a two year programme and we are close to 70% through that period. The fairways on most holes now require cutting and are showing real growth, and the ball is sitting up giving us a real chance with a fairway wood!

Olives still remains a challenge but better growth and condition is self-evident. We hope the new water pipe to supply better water to Olives will be laid this month. As ever we are continuing to repair/replace sprinkler heads and continue to improve the bunkers.

Some tees (two in particular) have gone backwards and these may require reseeding but the first of Pines is a testament to what can be achieved.

The greens have not been as quick as some of us like as they have not been micro tined and rolled in August but they remain firm and true and the poa grass seems to be under control (we have too much poa on the practise putting green) The speeding up of the greens has been promised over the month.

The health of the grasses looks good. The rough is tidy and only some detailed work on the bunkers and lake edges and pruning the pines requires further work over the winter.

We are by no means complacent but even our most verbal critics in the membership have been saying some nice things about the course!

The verticutting and in particular the tining of the fairways followed by feeding is working. We hope to confirm a repeat to some extent of that work in late October. Twice a year tining will make a difference.

Pinheiros remains very much the choice for many good players both members and visitors alike and our ambition is to offer an outstanding course in outstanding condition! As ever we remain vigilant.

PRO TIP - Ross Sutherland

How much sand to take – make a shallower swing and carve out less sand

Most players have problems in the sand because of an incorrect approach – both mentally and physically.

They try to hit an explosion shot, which causes them to swing down too steeply and dig out too much sand. As a result, they have to swing harder than is necessary and usually leave the ball in the sand or hit it way too far.



On normal shots, I prefer to think of slicing the ball out of the sand with a slightly open clubface, much as you would peel an apple. If the clubface stays slightly open into the sand, the bounce of the club comes into play and allows it to slide readily through the sand and under the ball.
