I would like to remind members that it is their responsibility to insure their guests are introduced at reception and sign the guest book, therefore please help us enforce this rule.

Any member wanting to rent an electric trolley should book it when booking the starting time to avoid disappointment, as we only have a limited number of electric rental trollies. Also if you own a private buggy make sure you read the notice below my report.

I look forward to seeing many of you around during the month of June and also joining us for the members' Gala Week at the end of July.

#### **NOTICE**

Please be advised that as of the 1st of June 2016, Portugal has introduced a penalty points system that includes heavy monetary fines.

This means that after you accumulate 12 points you will lose your driving licence for two years and after that period will need to take your driving test again.

Please be aware that golf buggies with no license plate cannot circulate on public roads. As you know, the roads in Quinta do Lago are considered public roads. The police authorities, who control and monitor traffic, can stop and check drivers deemed not in compliance with the road traffic act when driving on public roads. They can then issue a fine with penalty points.

Golf buggies must be licensed and have a registration number plate. They must also have lights, indicators, seat belts, mirrors and insurance if used on a public road.

Golf buggies can only be driven by a person with a licensed driver's insurance.

Any golf buggy driven on public roads, without complying with Portuguese traffic requirements, i.e. without a license plate, for example, can be confiscated, and its driver fined, prosecuted and awarded penalty points.

#### **NOTICE**

On request of the Portuguese Golf Federation and based on a new sportive rule, all members are required to produce a copy of an identification card (passport or driving license or residential card) to the Golf Office.

This should be handed to the Golf Office before the 31st of July in order to keep your licence active.


We all wish them both health and happiness in the future and we will welcome them back, for their holidays in September, with open arms.


## Putting

It is an interesting subject and many factors influence it.

Putter face alignment, path of putter, launch angle speed, impact location, hook or cut spin...the list goes on.

Bear a few statistics in mind. In 2014 a study found that face angle was 92% responsible for the balls initial direction with 8% due to the putter path. PGA Tour players only convert on average 56% of their 8 feet putts dropping to less than 10% from outside 25 feet.

Told you "putting was tough".



Before you head off buying new putters, spend a bit of time down on the putting green, checking your putter face alignment. It could prove to be a good starting point.

Failing that, call Doctor Ken or Doctor Ross, maybe we can help!

## Report from the Greens Committee

There is little to report this month but members will see that there has been a high level of activity on the course. A programme of scarifying and tining the fairways is under way. Nine holes are being closed in rotation and organic dressing has been applied to some greens, if not all. This is good news!

My disappointment is that our agronomist has not yet commented on the 12 month plan, which he was to consider and to advise us on timings, chemical applications and other matters relating to equipment, etc. I am confident we will be able to report his views next month.

I am also sure we will see an improvement in the course prior to Gala Week but we need to maintain a better standard throughout the year if we are to attract more members and satisfy our members.

The writer is away for nearly all of the next two weeks and previous experience has not been good but my committee will be on "alert".

Their comments on fairways and bunkers, etc, will follow.
