Director of Golf - Monthly Report

The highlight of January 2019 after the New Year's day scramble was the Algarvian Invitational Senior tournament which was played for its 7th year running. It was once more organized as a joint venture with Laranjal and played over Pinheiros Altos Pines-Corks course and at Laranjal course over 3 competitive rounds of Golf. The turn-out for this tournament was the largest ever with 135 players and over 80 top senior professionals. The prize money was just over €35.000 which also was the highest ever for the Algarvian Invitational which would not have been possible without our 2 main Sponsors Pinheiros Altos member Mr. John Waters and owner of Quinta do Lago Mr. Denis O'Brian.

The weather over the 3 days was amazing and the sunshine was present every day even than a little bit cold in the mornings but all the players were amazed with the climate in January in the Algarve.

Yet another Spaniard took the trophy this year, Former Ryder Cup player Miguel Angel Martin won for the 2nd time in this tournament with scores of 68 on Laranjal and 68 & 70 on Pinheiros Altos to be 3 in the lead from Michael Watson followed himself by former Algarvian Invitational Winner Andrew Oldcorn. Miguel Angel Martin took the winnings of €7.000.

The tournament was a huge success and all players were very compliment on the condition of both courses and also many mention on the improvement of the Pinheiros Altos greens which were up to 11 on the steam meter and that without rolling them.

We are already planning with Quinta do Lago the tournament for next year which will be played in the same format over 3 rounds over Pinheiros Altos & Laranjal.

Following the Algarvian Invitational we also organized in Partnership with Quinta do Lago, San Lorenzo & Dona Filipa hotel the fourth Algarvian Charity Pro Am which was played over Quinta do Lago South & North, San Lorenzo & Pinheiros Altos. Again another record was broken and I am not only talking about the scores but about the attendance as the Pro Am had 50 teams and 200 players enjoying another fantastic week while the weather did not let us down as it was probably the best climate week during January. The Pro Am was played over the 4 courses every day and Brian Evans, Mario Vitoria, Roger Caliço and myself each had their course to look after. The team worked very hard and the week went very smoothly.

The winners were David Coupland team with Simon Elkington, Trevor Newton & David Cartwright as his 3 amateurs with a score of 56 under par for the 4 days which might sound a lot but was only 2 points clear from last year's winner who finished in 2nd place Gordon Brand's team with John & Sumbaline Waters and Stephen East. I do think their secret weapon is Sumbaline!

As last year we had 2 different prize money, one for the 50 years old and over and the other for the players under 50 years old as well as Ladies Pro Prize if they get into the top 4 which Rebecca Hudson did finish in third spot. The individual Pro score was won for the seniors by Simon Brown shooting 9 under par for the 4 rounds and the youngsters prize money was for the third year running for David Coupland who shot 16 under par for the 4 days and an outstanding 64 on Quinta do Lago North.

On a personal note I would like to thank all the staff involved from Pinheiros Altos & Quinta do Lago in organizing both tournaments and specially the green staff as well as all the golf staff as & the hotel staff who looked after the players off the course.

Also a big thank you on my behalf for the continued support from John Waters in both tournaments as well as all his input to lounge an amateur senior mini tour which I am sure will see the light in 2020 and I will have more information to come soon.

Winter Medal was won by Amanda Stretton with a score of 68 beating Sally Evans with a better back nine and Lady Captain Lisa Burns was 3rd with a 69.

The January Stableford again was dominated by ladies as Lorraine Dunabin took the 1st spot with 40 points followed by Diana Collins with 35 points and thanks to Hayden Brooke with 34 points in third to save the honor for the men in January.

I would like to remind every member who play in competitive golf that you should make sure your handicap is active

meaning having 4 qualifying scores over the last 12 months in order to claim victory in board competition. Any member whose handicap is not active will not be eligible to win board competitions. The 4 qualifying scores can be played in regular tournaments or extra day scores handed in the Golf Office for recording.

Also do not forget if you are not able to play the Stablefords on Sundays you can now arrange your own game on the Saturday (day before the Monthly Stableford) and have your score counting for the competition. Make sure you play the same course as the competition is booked for on the Sunday.

I am delighted that Andy Georges has accepted to be the candidate nominated by the committee to be the future Vice-Captain as from the next AGM while his wife Sue Georges will be the Lady Vice Captain. I am sure that both of them will be a great credit to the Golf Committee and their experience of many years in the Golf Industry will bring a lot to the Club and I look forward to be able to work with them in developing the Golf Club over the next few years.

Alan Bentley & Debbie Madgett will be taking over their roles of Captains in April and I can assure you we are looking at a very active and fun year ahead as they are already planning many activities on the Golf Course as well as off the Golf course.

Please keep an eye open for the special day on 17th March to celebrate St Patrick's Day which will be the last Charity event for Captain Michael Collins and also the Mens Pairs Matchplay to be played from 28th February 2019 while we are at the door step of the St Valentine Week end which looks like for once we will get 2 days of good weather and should manage both rounds!

Also a reminder that the Golf Club AGM is on April 18th 2019 and we look forward to see as many of you there.

I wish you all a great start to the Golf Season and look forward to see many of you in the next few weeks!

Report from the Greens Committee

The committee has not met this month due to difficulties of member's availability and the extent of competitive play on the course. However informal discussions have taken place and we hope to be able to have a more detailed report on progress for next month and in particular before the AGM in April.

Members will have seen that extensive pruning of the pines has taken place on "Pines" and over the entire course which will allow both better sighting of the greens and fairways from the tree areas and allow more light onto the course.

The planting over approximately 1000 pines over 10 years ago and the loss of so few of the trees whilst on the one hand shows good husbandry had also made the course too restrictive for many shots from the rough!

There is still some major pruning to be done on the left of 8 of Pines and the committee have been asked to look at some specific tree removal by some ladies relating to the three pines to the left of the green of 4 of Pines. The committee is also waiting for some specific tree pruning of trees to the left of 4 of Pines for shots from the tee and the left and right of the fairway on 7 of Corks for the third shot to the green.

The weather proves to be typical of this time of the year with intermittent cold nights but frequent warm sunny days. Night temperatures need to improve and more rain is needed to encourage growth. Sanding of fairways and greens continues .Feeding is due to take place very shortly. The extensive fungus disease in particular on the fairway of 2 of Corks is unsightly and is being treated. The Committee very much hope that this problem can be overcome in the future with better growth and more resistant grasses.

The greens remain outstanding being firm and fast and testament to the better bent grasses which have now become more established. Members seem to like the challenge of fast greens but professional opinion is that over 10 on the stimp meter for greens with our strong contours maybe too challenging for a resort course? Perhaps members will indicate their views?

Warmer nights and feeding of the course should start to show in improved fairways as long as we have more rain!

We are making slow but positive progress and the greens staff understand what we all hope for and now seems within reach with better management and increased funding.

The AGM starts the beginning of a very active golf season and we wish all members good golfing and welcome comments on course improvement.
