Report from the Greens Committee

The full committee met on the 4th March with the Director of golf, the course manager Marco and Ana our environment manager.

The committee believe the course is well presented with extensive work being done over the last few months and this year we believe we will see real improvement to the fairways.

The Greens:-

Weekly sanding and feeding monthly has improved the grasses to give a greater percentage of bent grasses (STRI advise these should be at 85% similar to the Open courses in UK).

They were very fast over January and February but with added feed and some warmer weather and rain are presently running at 8/8.5 on the "stimp meter". They are however very firm and true and show very few pitch marks.

Tees:-

Marco hopes to complete the new ladies tee on Pines 2 and expand the tee on 8 of corks in the next few months. Improvements need to be made to several tees which show wear from the extensive play over the last few months. The committee believe tees are improving and generally reflect the course improvements.

Bunkers:-

Duncan Evans has agreed to work with Marco in improving some of the bunkers where the sand slopes too severely from the front to the centre of the bunker. A ball entering the bunker should come to rest on a reasonably flat area of sand unless it has plugged in the face.

The water leak on 2 of Pines front bunker is being looked at. In the main the excessive sand has been compacted or reduced in most bunkers. The long bunker on 6 of Olives will be split so all the sand on the left of fairway will be designated as "waste ground" and a stretch of new turf will designate the bunker area to the left of the green.

Fairways:-

The fairways were fed and verticut earlier this year. The colour has improved but as yet the growth needed on many holes has not started. Marco will be feeding again this month and with warmer weather and more rain growth should start. The nine holes of Pines, Corks and Olives will be shut in 3 consecutive weeks in June to carry out further extensive maintenance. The kikuya grasses are to be encouraged and the very substantial improvement to Olives fairways shows what can be achieved.

General:-

The tree lobbing and tree removal is complete apart from one branch to be removed on the corner pine of 8 of Pines. The canopy on 8 of Pines now shows full light and we expect the grasses to start growing in this area. Extra light to all areas of the course were desperately needed and will improve growth and health of the grasses.

The committee have considered several concerns relating to course improvements. In no particular order these are:-

1. The removal of the bunkers at 3 of Corks is satisfactory but we believe the grass should but cut down to stop balls holding near the front edge of the green. The intention was that balls slightly short of the green should role back to the grassy hollow.

2. The bunker to left of Pines 9 we believe should be filled and made into a grassy hollow. At present there is a "double jeopardy" in landing in the bunker as the large Pine prevents a shot to most of the green area and lessening this difficulty is preferred to removing the pine. 3. The 3 pine trees protecting the left side of 4 of Pines green have become a difficult obstacle for some ladies for their shot to the green. The committee whilst sympathetic do not want to remove this hazard to this short par 5 as there is ample space to hit a shot to the green from the main fairway. However it has been agreed that the oleander bushes should be "thinned" as a ball in this area cannot be either found or even when dropped under penalty be played with the bushes so thickly packed.

4. Finally members will be pleased to learn that the owners have agreed to employ a full time calcada repairer who is due to start work soon. He has a lot to do! The committee believe we are making progress with the support of Marco his staff and our Director who has supported the increased investment in the course which has been approved by JJW.

We hope to make a further report prior to the AGM in late April.
