# Report from the Greens Committee

The full committee met on the 10th July and there was much discussion about the concerns expressed in our June report.

This report is far more optimistic and accurately reflects the substantial improvement in all areas of course condition.

#### Fairways

The planned verticutting and scarifying of the fairways took place as planned during June. The course has been treated with fertilizer, not just once but twice! The recovery of the grasses and improvement in both colour and grass sward is substantial and now is as good if not better than many of our neighbours. There are still some areas where poor irrigation has resulted in a thin coverage of grass and these require further treatment particularly if "placing" is likely to be lifted. The committee would like to see "placing" lifted but the decision is yet to be made.

There remain problems in irrigating "Olives" and the club is budgeting for new controllers to be fitted on this nine hole next year at a substantial cost. Similar work has taken place at San Lourenco with we understand success.

Marco and his team have worked hard to bring the course to its present state and are to be congratulated.

#### Greens

Firm surfaces, good colour and reasonable speeds with much reduces dollar spot and other weed grasses is testament to the policy set up following the STRI reports and there is much to be pleased about! The additional sanding is showing results and the change to cutting schedules seems to be successful.

#### Tees

There is still work to be done both regarding condition and also changes to the ladies tee on hole 2 of Pines and expanding the tee of 8 on Corks. The tee on 1 of Pines is a good example of what can be achieved.

#### Bunkers

Duncan Evans has agreed to assist in improving some bunkers where the inclines are unfair. We cannot prevent some plugging but in the main excessive sand is much improved.

#### General issues

Calcada paths are being re-laid and the work on 1 of Pines is a good example of what can be achieved. It will take time!

The bridge on 9 of Olives is about to reopen thanks to Duncan and his team who have found an economical way in carrying out a complex and difficult reconstruction.

We head into gala week with a belief that members and visitors will enjoy good playing conditions and that the frustrations expressed in our last report are behind us and we remain optimistic for the future.


