Report from the Greens Committee

The whole committee met on Monday the 31st of August. In order to respond to what we believe are members' main concerns and the plan for the future maintenance of the course we will set out what we consider are our view of the course and hopes for the future.

Presentation

The committee complimented Marco on the presentation of the course which bearing in mind both the lock down and in particular the absence of financial support until very recently was «remarkable».

Tees

With a few exceptions the tees are much improved, in particular visitors starting on the first of Pines see good growth and few divots. There are still some «grumbles» from the ladies that the repositioning of the tee on Pines 2 is too short a hole for its handicap. We have not done a survey on ladies scores but we are «watching the position».

Fairways

All the committee are surprised at the improvement of the surfaces in particular Olives and several holes on both Pines and Corks where there was poor growth now show new grasses and «stripes» from cutting. Marco advises that this is a reflection of the kikuyu grasses which STRI said we should develop has indeed spread better than expected! Correct cutting of this grass is challenging but we hope to maintain the improvement subject to investment. The two months plus when the course was free of buggies and foot fall has been a major contributing factor.

We do however need to quickly maintain the STRI schedule of sanding feeding and scarifying as soon as possible.

Greens

The greens are a major challenge and the burning off of surfaces and the growth of seasonal weeds has been a real concern!

Watering of the greens was maintained during lockdown but the absence of sand and both fertilizer and the chemical which prevents irrigation water from «running off» some greens has been the cause of the «burning».

Marco explained that during the very hot weather night time temperatures and strong winds burnt the fine grass on as many as 30% of the greens. The funding for the chemicals to stop running off of water and sand and fertilizer should we are advised provide a full recovery by the end of this month.

The greens are not fast! We would prefer more speed but recovery must take priority and the dying off of the seasonal weeds will allow better speeds.

Concern has been addressed as to whether the holes are slightly «crowned». Marco is investigating to ensure the «plate» is used when cutting new holes.

There is no doubt that putting has become more difficult with balls constantly "jumping" out from the shallow holes now demanded from the government to prevent touching the flag!

Bunkers

Apart from daily raking nothing has been done to improve some inconsistencies in our bunkers. Some members have invested in carrying small portable rakes and the committee applaud them and wonder whether we can make these available within the club?

Future Maintenance

This is the most contentious issue and depends entirely on future funding and in maintaining a skilled course work force. All our staff are vital but none more so than the course staff who we must support!

The committee believe that our old and quickly becoming redundant machinery must be replaced! Sufficient funding for this and for all the sand and fertilizers now required are becoming vital for our future success. Members have thankfully in the main been both patient and loyal.

The greens committee are doing all we can but these are challenging times!

We are happy to answer issues the members raise about the course but we are of course restrained by budget issues. We remain optimistic but realistic!
