#### Cormorants

We seem to have had a noticeable increase in the number of resident cormorants over the last few months. They have taken up residence on the pond in front of the 5th of Olives teebox. The juvenile is the one with the large white belly on the right of a trio with reeds behind him/her.

Cormorants dive to find fish – which is their staple diet. Many of you will have seen pictures of Chinese fishermen on a boat with their cormorants with ropes around their necks to stop the birds eating the bigger fish but allowing them to eat smaller ones. I believe this practice is now purely a show for tourists. Suffice to say they have a huge appetite, so don't expect to see many fish left in our ponds!

The other noticeable act of cormorants is the pre-historic looking drying of their wings! There are various theories about why this happens, but at the end of the day the conclusion is that they need to dry their wings after they have been fishing!!

There are roughly 40 species of aquatic birds around the world known as cormorants and shags, and those with a crest on their heads are mainly known as shags. Many people have come up to me over the years and asked about the difference between a cormorant and a shag, and my answer has always been "There is nothing quite like a good cormorant".

On a completely related subject..... over the next 6-8 weeks it will be the breeding season for birds. If you want to have a walk without a set of golf clubs, then get down to the Ria Formosa in the area between the salt mountains, the path to the airport/Praia do Faro and the 8th tee box of San Lorenzo, and take a pair of binoculars if you have them. There are so many birds to see there. Yesterday I saw avocets and black winged stilts. with their bright leg reds, already arrived. Also on the pond in front of the 8th of Olives you will probably see the procession of pochards when the males start chasing the females. I have attached a photo of a male pochard to assist with recognition.

Towards the end of February, we had the past Captain Challenge which a few of the past captains could not attend as this is not the usual time for this trophy as it was postponed from 2020 and then 2021. The Captain pays for the lunch so managed to fit it in before he passes on the Captaincy to Tony Hickey in April. Paul Cotterill won easily with 40 points, 10 points ahead of the President who was second! Obviously, his handicap is now under the radar! The lunch following the Captains day was one of the best we ever had in the Club and also accompanied

The repaired calçada path will help to respect this rule and the ranger will be instructed to be more vigilant in regards to buggy usage.

Works on the course and the mainly greens & fairways are being carried out and the improvement can be seen specially on the greens while fairways will improve as we enter the growing season.

Also, I would like to remind members that pets are not allowed in the Clubhouse, terrace areas and golf course and that the bar & Golf staff have been asked to enforce the rule.

The Club AGM is on  $14^{\rm th}$  April and all relevant information is below in this newsletter. The nominated member from the committee for Vice Club Captain is Steve Coull while Melody Cotterill will become the Lady Captain.

The February medal was won by Dawn Warnock in Division 1 with 70 nett, and Wendy Evans in Division 2 with 71 nett.


On 9<sup>th</sup> February the **Ladies Foursomes Championship** was strongly contested, the proud winners of the Trophy were Helen

Team colours can be agreed with your partner, this always makes for good photos ☺



# Report from the Greens Committee

The whole committee met on the 28 February to discuss the advice received from the recent visit from STRI and to consider the planned maintenance for the course over the coming months.

#### STRI report

The visit from Conor who has been visiting the course for several years was very welcome. He has not been to PA since November 2019.

His written report has not yet been received but in a meeting with the writer we gained the impression that he was pleased at how the course had been managed through the last 2 difficult years. The greens are running at 9.5/10.00 on the stimp meter. There is some dollar spot on some greens but Marco believes on advice from Conor this can be eradicated.

Before the Pandemic the percentage of bent grass on the greens was 85%. It is now 45% but with fertilizer and sand applications we believe the level will quickly increase.

The bunkers are improving through the application of better raking and the work Duncan has started to prevent balls holding on the up slopes.

#### Irrigation Plans

Member will be aware that the older holes were to receive a new satellite irrigation system similar to that at San Lourenco. Investigation has shown that work in removing and placing the power lines at greater depth will delay an early start on this expensive programme but we are assured it will take place. The lack of seasonal rain is a real concern and we must hope that the bore holes will not be vulnerable over the coming months.

#### Calcada Work

There has been good work done but there is still a lot to complete. We hope to see progress very shortly.

The difficulty in driving buggies over the calcada has caused many members to avoid the paths and to take their buggies over the grass which long term will cause severe damage. In addition we believe there is room on the fairways of many holes when access should be available from the calcada to within say 40 meters before the greens. We hope to be able to give members who need to use buggies better access to the course without causing damage. It is a difficult balance but good course condition will never be achieved if buggies are allowed a full freedom of movement.

#### Trees

It is the view of the committee that the number and growth of the many new fir trees has to be checked by careful pruning to give a better balance of risk and reward. No one likes the prospect of balls being held in the tree canopy. Marco is looking at a series of holes we have identified including Pines 1 and 9, 1 and 4 of corks and maybe a few more!

Keen gardeners will know that the growth of trees and maintaining a perfect sward on grass is a continuous challenge. The weather and investment play a major role together with expertise to a successful conclusion. We are fortunate in having Marco and his team and now with better funding we just need the weather to behave!

The committee believe that PA can and will challenge our competitors in being a leading course on the Algarve.


