Mute Swan

The pair of mute swans that we have on the pond between the 3rd and 4th of Olives arrived just a few months before the Covid pandemic closed the course in Spring 2020.

Mute swans are so named because they are less vocal than other swan species. They do make a variety of sounds often described as "grunting, hoarse whistling and snorting noises". So in terms of their residing in PA, they blend in quite well with all the various roll-ups on a Wednesday and Friday! If you get too close to them, the male (cob) especially, there will be some aggressive movement towards you and some very loud hissing. A swan can give you a terrible bite/nip with it's beak, so please do not get too close.

The other identifying feature of a mute swan is that it is completely white with an orange beak bordered with black and has a pronounced knob on the top of the beak, which is larger in males.

I took some photos on the 22nd March following the extreme rain that we have been getting and it seemed that there may be a nest building operation on the 4th fairway side. As I mentioned in my last article, this is the breeding season so let's hope that it is. We will wait and see.



Report from the Greens Committee

The committee have not been able to meet since our last report as Marco is on holiday but members will have read the recent letter from course Director Christophe who explains the recent difficulty with "dollar spot".

This short report is to bring members upto date on course conditions and treatments.

Greens

The greens are running at 9/9.5 on the "stimp" meter which is satisfactory. The planned fertilising with sand and fertiliser is continuing. The course remains dry despite recent rain fall. Those who take readings on the reservoirs say we need a wet April. One advantage is that whilst the calcada is being repaired buggy use is not causing damage on the course. However members should try not to use areas which leaves tyre marks! This is evident on the area to 7 of Olives tee and to tee of 8 of corks!

The dollar spot has been treated and over seeding and feeding should reduce the damage quickly. Christophe has explained the back ground to the damage as previously commented.

Tees

Tees need feeding and warmer weather for improved growth and at present are not good. We hope for much improvement this month!

Fairways

The fairways remain dry with poor growth. Feeding with irrigation and more rain and warmer nights should enable

the kiku grasses to flourish to give better surfaces for striking with driving clubs! It is appropriate to maintain placing for the time being. Funding is available and we remain hopeful that the course can be returned to the 2019 quality we enjoyed!

Trees

Members will recall that the committee with Marco and the Director have been considering whether certain trees have become too invasive and "unfair". Rather than remove many trees Marco has carried out quite severe pruning of certain trees, the most important being 1st of Pines protecting the green and 9 of pines protecting the green. It waits to be seen if this works well?

Finally we believe we are moving forward albeit slowly. We are not being helped by unusual weather and also a shortage of man power. We are several men short of green staff and recruitment is proving difficult!

Bunkers

There is clear evidence that the bunkers are much improved! We just need to keep raking and try to keep out of them!

We trust Marco will return from holiday with renewed energy for the challenges ahead. We can assure members that our course is better than many others but still not where we want it to be! We wish the new incoming Captain and Lady Captain every success in their year and we hope the course will reward their enthusiasm!





World handicap system

- . Open my FPG
- . Click on Playing HCP Calc
- . Your H/C Index and gender will automatically be shown
- . Enter the course you are playing and click on Calculate (Fig. 1)
- . Your playing handicap and percentages for both 18 and 9 holes will be shown (Fig. 2)
