



Report from the Greens Committee

Report from Greens Committee

The committee met with Antonio and Christophe on the 9th of August. Only Duncan Evans being unavailable.

We will attempt to report to members both the improvements which have been achieved and the difficulties working in the driest and hottest summer for many years.

Course condition

Despite a serious shortage of man power (15 against 23!) the holes in Corks and Pines show a much improved sward of grass in all fairways, greens put well despite serious scorching on some greens. We believe when both rains return and the water irrigation is working at full capacity there will be a quick restoration to burnt surfaces. The presentation of hole 1 of Pines is as good as we can remember for many years. We need all our holes to be as good!

Resources

The shortage of manpower is having an effect on Antonio's ability to deal with the cosmetic detail we want to see in our course.

The calcada is despite a large investment in repair still unacceptable on many holes! Christophe is aware of the problem but we are unable to say when the work will be completed.

The course relies on bore holes for its water when there is a drought. We have quite a few but the license to use them is costly! We are at risk of a potential high fine for over use!

The cost of maintaining the bore holes has become more difficult because of historic neglect. Money is now better controlled and budgets are agreed which underlines the need for a large investment in new equipment and improved irrigation. We are promised a satellite system which has been installed in San Lorenzo. It is expensive but essential to be able to irrigate both rough, fairways and

greens from a central control.

The course owner has been staying at PA recently and we hope he will see the challenges ahead if we are to challenge Quinta as the best course in the Algarve! We believe that is his ambition!

Course problems

There are obvious areas which need attention. In no particular order these are: -

Tree roots - Work has started but when manpower is restored much work is still to be done!

Tree removal - We are hoping to start a large tree removal as soon as weather conditions make this safe! David Ford has correctly pointed to the trees on corks 9 being so large that the approach to this difficult hole is limited to the left of the fairway! Tree will be reduced as soon as possible! We are "over occupied with trees".

Bunkers - Our sand is not the best! It becomes hard and impossible for our ladies (and men) if not deep raked and frequently. It is impossible with the present man shortage. We would like to see better sand in the long term!

The fairways are much improved but we have held back from lifting the placing concession whilst the dry conditions make some fairways very difficult to execute a wooded club when the ball lies on bare ground! We hope to lift this very soon!

We believe our new course manager is very well qualified to take the course to a new high level. We just have to hope that the funding which is required will be forthcoming and we believe the investment will give exceptional rewards to our owner.
